COUNCIL REPORTS:

• MAYOR, Jim Bilella

-I would like to thank the Berlin Rotary for the donation of the bullet proof vest to our K-9 Officer Radko. I would also like to thank the Berlin Police Department and all the residents who made this year's "National Night Out" a wonderful success.

-On September 9, 2017, @ 6:00 pm, Lavender Koi Yoga Studio, located next to the Berlin Brewery, will be having their grand opening. This is a great opportunity to meet the instructors and enjoy free classes throughout the grand opening weekend.

- I had a meeting with the bank that owns the K-Mart Shopping Center. This property will be going up for sheriff's sale on August 30, 2017. This is a great redevelopment opportunity. They have meet with several developers who may be interested in this property. They would like to see this property sell quickly.

-On October 21, 2017, the Greater Berlin Business Association of Berlin will be sponsoring the annual Fall Fest on Broad Street from 10-4.

-We are also currently looking into taking advantage of the "Free Energy Audit Program". This program is sponsored by the Board of Public Utilities. I met with the head of the DEP and they explained how it can help our infrastructure. They also explained how to get this process started, how we can capitalize on this resource and what improvements it will make to the borough. We are hoping to get this started within the next month.

• BUILDINGS & GROUNDS, Chairman Len Badolato

• STREETS & ROADS, Chairman Dan MacDonnell

-The sidewalk project on Clementon Road is half way complete. The projected finish date is within the next 2-3 weeks. The intersection of Franklin Ave and Clementon Road is completed so there will be no major traffic issues during the start of the new school year.

-The Tansboro Road Camden County project is also almost complete.

-The 2017 Road Program went out to bid this past week. The lowest most reasonable bidder was South State Inc.

• WATER & SEWER, Chairman Ron Rocco

-The water & sewer statistics for July 2016 vs. July 2017 were read. These statistics included water & sewer income and water and sewer connections.

- There were no water quality complaints for July 2017.

-Upgrading of plant two was completed. All pumps and nine pump stations were maintained including Well 15.

-There were 96 utility mark out requests completed.

-Tonight, a resolution is on the agenda to introduce on replacing the water main on Harrison Ave. in West Berlin. It went out to bid and we had seven bidders. The lowest bid was for \$110,000.00. The work is to begin in August to be completed in December 2017.

-The sewer project will begin on August 22 to be completed in September. This project will replace 920 feet of sewer line.

-We will also be going out to bid for the sewer video machine. We hope to purchase this within the next few months. This system will save the Borough \$15,000.00 per survey. This can also be considered as a shared service.

• HEALTH & RECREATION, Chairman Mike Buchanan

- Camp- Long- A- Coming came to close at the beginning of this month. I would like to thank director Erin Maloney and her staff. We had a record breaking number of campers this year. The local Community Center is used for this six- week program. The added vending machine were also a great hit.

- I am working with the engineers and the electricians on the bidding process for the path lighting near the Community Center. We are looking to go out to bid on this project in the near future. I am also working with the Soccer Club on the 2017 County Grant to install lights on the soccer field parking lot area.

• **<u>PUBLIC SAFETY, Chairman Jim Pearce</u>**

-Going forward, Chief Miller will be submitting a monthly performance report of K-9 Officer, Radko.

-The Chief has applied for the NJ State body armor replacement grant.

- Our "National Night Out" event was a huge success. We would like to expand next year. Many thanks go out to Officer Wolf and all residents who took part in our community wide block parties.

• PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

-We purchased our house at 15 Haines Ave. in 1988. We are currently not residing in the house, but it is being rented to a relative. It is located next to the West Berlin Bus Company, which when we purchased this house, this area was zoned R2. To our knowledge, the Zoning has not been changed to commercial use. We have been coming to Council meeting for over twenty years trying to get help. Some issues have been addressed in the past, but only for a temporary period of time. Here are just a few things of our concern:

- The use of a flatbed truck being used as storage
- Vehicles leaking oil
- Untagged vehicles on property
- Sand in their lot runs into the storm sewer
- Vehicles are left idling
- A 6ft. barb wire fence was installed 6 inches off of their property line
- Full size buses are being parked in this lot
- They are slowly encroaching onto our property.
- We are concerned that our property value will go down in value if we decide to sell.

- <u>Mayor Bilella</u> - I have contacted the Bus Company to set up a meeting to discuss these concerns. I am very aware of these problems and will personally address the zoning, buffering issues and work with them as residents, along with the business owners to try and resolve these matters. Could you please leave your contact information? Their information was left with Councilman MacDonnell who is on the planning board.

<u>Bill Bansch</u> 79 New Freedom Road Berlin, NJ 08009

- There is a problem with a property maintenance code enforcement issue on South Franklin Avenue. There are three broken sidewalk pads which are now considered a safety issue for the children who have to use this sidewalk to walk to school. I have issued this property owner 11 summons. This has been going on for over a year. To date, nothing has been fixed. Can this area be addressed and fixed by the current contractor that is currently fixing the sidewalks on Clementon Road? Can we address this problem and have it billed as a municipal lien against the property?

<u>Solicitor Daniel Long</u> – In order to fix this, an ordinance has to be in place. I am not sure if we passed an ordinance for this issue. If the construction official deems a certain property a safety issue than the municipality does have the legal right to go onto the property and make the necessary repairs. A lien can then be issued for the expenses that accrued as a result of the municipality having to make the repairs to the property.

<u>Mayor Bilella</u>- We will get the Construction Official to look at this property. If he declares this property a safety hazard, then we can utilize our forces to have this repaired and get this process started.
