Mayor Rick Miller called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Pearce motioned to approve the minutes. Hohing seconded the motion, which passed with all members present voting in favor in a Roll Call Vote.

COUNCIL REPORTS

- ➤ BUILDINGS, PARKS, & RECREATION Councilman Len Badolato reported that he had a meeting with the Director of the Library on building improvements. He further reported that the signs behind the C&M parking lot need to be fixed. He also reported he met with the Cemetery Board to improve communication and information available to residents.
- ➤ PUBLIC WORKS, STREETS & ROADS Councilman Andrew Simone reported that there is no official report for either departments. Over the last few weeks there have been communications with the Director of Public Works, Director of Projects, and Borough Engineer for projects to be completed this year. He further reported he hopes to have upcoming events and community projects for residents to look forward to. He commented that the safety upgrades on the White Horse Pike is a NJDOT project and is ongoing.
- ➤ WATER & SEWER Councilwoman Patricia Cummings reported for water, all routine maintenance at Cross Keys treatment plant was completed. Started prepping plant #2 for summer demand. 78 utility mark outs were done. Repaired service leak on Haines Ave. Completed hydrant flushing in the Borough. Flushing in Berlin Township starts Monday, April 18. For sewer, completed all routine monthly maintenance at our 10 pump stations. Completed all routine monthly maintenance on our 10 emergency back up generators at the sewer pump stations. Scada installation on the remaining 4 pump stations is scheduled to be completed by April 29th, and at that point all 10 pump stations will be on the Scada system.
- ▶ PUBLIC SAFETY Council President Pearce reported that the Berlin Police Department handled a total of 1,944 calls. No need to speed focused on Washington Ave., Tansboro Rd., Cross Keys Rd., Franklin Ave., and Clementon Rd. For EMS, responded to 229 calls in March 2022, and of those calls 92 were in Berlin Borough. For OEM, they continued to train with all other departments and Spring Oaks Nursing Home. For the Fire Department responded to 68 calls for the month of March 2022, and continued to receive training on Tuesday nights which included lock out training, driver training, forest fire training, and continued to staff weekly safe for grant training. Thanked everyone for their work while preparing the budget.
- COMMUNICATION Councilman Keith Hohing reported that he maintained website notifications and updates throughout the month. He attended various department meetings regarding budget preparation. Commented on Councilman Badolato's report that the cemetery properties seem to be getting cleaned up.
- FINANCE Chairman Jake Miller reported that the budget will be introduced this evening. The budget will have a 1.5 cent increase. Thanked the CFO, department heads and council for preparing the budget. The total revenues collected for the month of March 2022 are as follows:

- ➤ SOLICITOR Solicitor Howard Long had nothing to report.
- ➤ MAYOR Mayor Rick Miller reported that the rabies clinic on Saturday, April 9. He commented that several towns had cancelled their rabies clinic on the same day, which made the event more chaotic than expected. Last year there were only 51 vaccines administered; this year 125 vaccines were administered. Thanked the clerk and volunteers for their assistance. He reminded residents that the town wide yard sale will be April 30th. Thanked the Fire Department for having the Easter Bunny out this past Saturday. He reported that department heads met with an outside agency hired by NJDOT to replace crossings at Washington Ave. The Mayor reported he has no update on McClellan Ave.

Pearce motioned to approve the monthly reports. Badolato seconded the motion, which passed with all members present voting in favor in a Roll Call Vote.

 RES. 2022:043 AUTHORIZE PLACE-TO-PLACE TRANSFER (EXTENSION OF PREMISES) – WOODBRIAR CORPORATION

WHEREAS, an application has been filed for a place-to-place transfer (expansion of premises) of Plenary Retail Consumption License 0405-33-006-003, for purposes of expanding the premises under license wherein the sale, service, and storage of alcoholic beverages are authorized; and

WHEREAS, the submitted application form is complete in all respects, the transfer fees have been paid, and the license has been properly renewed for the current license term;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Berlin does hereby approve, effective April 14, 2022, the expansion of the aforesaid Plenary Retail Consumption licensed premises located at 23 Clementon Road, Berlin, NJ 08009, to place under license the area delineated in the application form and the sketch of the licensed premises attached thereto.

• RES. 2022:044 RESOLUTION URGING THE SWIFT PASSAGE OF S-330/A3804, WHICH SHALL RESTORE THE ENERGY TAX RECEIPTS TO MUNICIPALITIES

WHEREAS, taxes on gas and electric utilities were originally collected by the host municipalities to be used for local purposes and to compensate the public for the use of their rights of way; and

WHEREAS, when the State made itself the collection agent for these taxes, it promised to dedicate the proceeds to municipal property tax relief; since, just as municipalities collect property taxes for the benefit of school districts, counties, and other entities, the State is supposed to collect Energy Taxes for the benefit of municipal governments; and

WHEREAS, for years, though, State budget makers have diverted funding from Energy Taxes to fund State programs; and instead of being spent on local programs and services and used to offset property taxes, the money has been spent as successive Legislatures and Administrations have seen fit; and

WHEREAS, the diversion of dedicated energy tax receipts to the State's General Fund further jeopardizes this critical property tax relief funding in future years; and

WHEREAS, by reducing Consolidated Municipal Property Tax Relief Act (CMPTRA), which is also comprised of revenues that should be returned to municipalities, State Budget makers have been able to continue collecting Energy Taxes, while keeping additional revenue that should have been returned to provide property tax relief; and

WHEREAS, the cumulative impact of years of underfunding has left many municipalities with serious needs and burdensome property taxes; and

WHEREAS, local elected officials are in the best position to decide the best use of these resources, which were always intended to fund local programs and services; and

WHEREAS, Senator Singleton and Senate President Scutari have introduced legislation (S-330) that will restore, over a five-year period, Energy Tax Receipts to municipalities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Berlin, Camden County, urges the Legislature to swiftly pass this legislation and Governor Murphy sign the legislation prior to passage of the FY2023 State budget; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution is forwarded to Senate President Scutari, Assembly Speaker Coughlin, Governor Murphy, and the League of Municipalities

RES. 2022:045 APPROVE CHANGE ORDER #1 – PARK AVENUE WATER MAIN

WHEREAS, the Borough of Berlin has entered a contract with DSC Construction Inc., as authorized by Resolution R08-01;2019 and has committed sufficient funds to pay for the Park Avenue Water Main Project; and

WHEREAS, Pennoni Associates, Inc., has recommended changes that will decrease the original contract price of \$417,760.00, as modified by Change Order #1, dated April 8, 2022, by \$380.00 to a revised contract price of \$417,380.00; and
