REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

THURSDAY, MAY 12, 2022 - 7:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER AND FLAG SALUTE

Mayor Rick Miller called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

SUNSHINE NOTICE

Mayor Miller stated that adequate notice of this meeting had been given in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Act, Pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231. Said notice has been advertised in the Courier-Post, The Philadelphia Inquirer, and posted on the Borough Hall Bulletin Board showing the said meeting's date, place, and time.

Pearce motioned to approve the minutes. Hohing seconded the motion, which passed with all members present voting in favor in a Roll Call Vote.

COUNCIL REPORTS

- BUILDINGS, PARKS, & RECREATION Councilman Len Badolato reported the DBRC will be holding the Strawberry Festival will be held on Saturday, May 14, 2022 on the Borough Hall grounds.
- PUBLIC WORKS, STREETS & ROADS Councilman Andrew Simone reported that there was a bid opening for the 2021 roadway improvement. Councilman Simone reported that in the past, the Borough had budgeted \$450,000-\$550,000 for the roadway improvement projects. In the last couple of years they have reduced the budgeted projects to about \$250,000-\$300,000, as the Borough receives a substantial amount of funding from the New Jersey Department of Transportation, which would cover the majority of costs, and the Borough would reallocate funds to other projects. Councilman Simone indicated that there have been requests from residents to repave their road, and further indicated that roads are assessed and recommendation by the Borough Engineer and Public Works for priority on which roads are to be completed first. Requests that came in within the last year are in the running to be completed for the next year. Councilman Simone reported that the Superintendent is looking to hire two temporary laborers for the summer to allow skilled laborers on board to do other projects during the cold months. Councilman Simone indicated that June 2nd is the expected delivery date for the street sweeper.
- WATER & SEWER Councilwoman Patricia Cummings reported for water, all routine maintenance at Cross Keys treatment plant was completed. Rebuilt line pump at plant #1, pump is back in service. Completed 81 mark out requests. Leak on Route 73 was repaired. April hydrant flushing is complete. For sewer, completed all routine monthly maintenance at our 10 pump stations. Completed all routine monthly maintenance on our 10 emergency back up generators at the sewer pump stations. Replaced 2 aging pumps for the Smokey Run pump station.
- PUBLIC SAFETY Council President Pearce reported that the Berlin Police Department handled a total of 1,805 calls. No need to speed focused on Jackson Road. For OEM, they continued to work with all other Borough departments. For EMS, responded to 236 calls in April 2022, and of those calls 97 were in Berlin Borough. For the Fire Department responded to 64 calls for the month of April 2022. Council President Pearce reported that on the agenda is the public hearing and adoption of Ordinance 2022:05, and stated that there are more details to work out prior to passing this ordinance, and he would like to table it until further notice.
- COMMUNICATION Councilman Keith Hohing was not in attendance.
- FINANCE Chairman Jake Miller reported that the governing body will be adopting the budget this evening. The budget will have a 1.6 cent increase. Based upon the average value of homes in Berlin Borough of \$235,000, the increase equates to a \$38.00 yearly increase, or

a minimal increase of \$9.50. The total revenues collected for the month of April 2022 are as follows:

- SOLICITOR Solicitor Howard Long reported that he would like the Governing Body to consider adding the Res. 2022:069 to the agenda. This resolution would be to rescind Resolution 2022:026 since the agreement that was authorized by the resolution has never been accepted.
- MAYOR Mayor Rick Miller reported that Camp Long-A-Coming will start July 5th. Eastern High School's graduation will be Monday, June 20th. Berlin Community School's graduation will be on June 16th.

Pearce motioned to approve the monthly reports. Simone seconded the motion, which passed with all members present voting in favor in a Roll Call Vote.

• ORD. 2022:05 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 9 OF THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE OPERATION AND GOVERNMENT OF THE BERLIN BOROUGH POLICE DEPARTMENT THROUGH THE ADOPTION CERTAIN AMENDMENTS TO THE MANUAL ENTITLED "BERLIN BOROUGH POLICE DEPARTMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS"

• RES. 2022:054 AUTHORIZING THE 2022 MUNICIPAL BUDGET TO BE READ BY TITLE

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-8 stipulates, at the public hearing the budget shall be read in full, or it may be read by its title, if:

1. At least one week before the date of the hearing and at the hearing, a complete copy of the approved budget shall be made available for public inspection and has been made available to each person upon request, and

2. By resolution passed by not less than a majority of the full membership, the governing body determines that the budget shall be read by its title and declare that the conditions outlined in subsection 1. of this section have been met.

WHEREAS, the Municipal has confirmed these conditions have been met.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Berlin, in the County of Camden and State of New Jersey, that the 2022 Municipal Budget shall be read by title only.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body and the State of New Jersey Department of Community Affairs has authorized and approved the adoption of the 2022 Municipal Budget for the Borough of Berlin; and

WHEREAS all the statutory requirements have been met; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body in the Borough of Berlin, in the County of Camden, State of New Jersey, that the 2022 Municipal Budget herein set forth is hereby adopted and shall constitute an appropriation for the purposes stated, and the sums therein set forth.

RES. 2022:056 AUTHORIZE EXECUTION OF SHARED SERVICE AGREEMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION CLERK WITH THE BOROUGH OF LAUREL SPRINGS

WHEREAS, the Borough of Berlin desires to enter into a Shared Service Agreement for the services of a Construction Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Laurel Springs is agreeable to providing said services;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by Mayor and Council of the Borough of Berlin to authorize the execution of the Shared Service Agreement with the Borough of Laurel Springs for Construction Clerk services.

RES. 2022:057 AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH OF BERLIN TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH BUCKINGHAM PARTNERS, LLC ("BUCKINGHAM")

WHEREAS, Buckingham is the contract purchaser of commercial property located at Block 1100, Lots 4, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 9.01 on the Berlin Borough Tax Map ("Property"); and

WHEREAS, Buckingham is interested in redeveloping the Property into a mixed use development of residential units and commercial/retail space (the "Redevelopment"); and

WHEREAS, in order to so, it is necessary for the Borough and Buckingham to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, entering into the MOU will promote the public health, safety and general welfare of the residents of Berlin Borough.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Berlin, County of Camden and State of New Jersey that:

(3) The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of the Borough of Berlin; and

(4) A copy of this Resolution shall be published in the official newspapers as required by law within ten (10) days of its passage.

RES. 2022:058 SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION FOR DMHAS GRANT FUNDING FOR BERLIN-GIBBSBORO-VOORHEES MUNICIPAL ALLIANCE

WHEREAS, the Governor's Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse (GCADA) established the Municipal Alliances for the Prevention of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse in 1989 to educate and engage residents, local government and law enforcement officials, schools, nonprofit organizations, the faith community, parents, youth and other allies in efforts to prevent alcoholism and drug abuse in communities throughout New Jersey. In coordination with GCADA, the New Jersey Department of Human Services/Division on Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS) has awarded a Youth Leadership Grant to the GCADA Municipal Alliance Program.

WHEREAS, The Borough Council of the Borough of Berlin, County of Camden, State of New Jersey recognizes that the abuse of alcohol and drugs is a serious problem in our society amongst persons of all ages; and therefore, has an established Municipal Alliance Committee; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council further recognizes that it is incumbent upon not only public officials but upon the entire community to take action to prevent such abuses in our community; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has applied for DMHAS Youth Leadership funding through the Governor's Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse through the County of Camden;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough of Berlin, County of Camden, State of New Jersey hereby recognizes the following:

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Berlin passed Resolution 2022:026 on February 10, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 2022:026 authorized the governing body to execute a retirement agreement with Patrolman Thomas Locke; and

WHEREAS, as of May 12, 2022, the terms of said agreement have not been agreed upon between the Patrolman Thomas Locke and the Borough of Berlin; and

WHEREAS, upon recommendation of the Borough Solicitor, the governing body of the Borough of Berlin wishes to rescind and revoke Resolution 2022:026 in its entirety as the agreement tendered therein has not been accepted at this time;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Berlin that Resolution 2022:026 is hereby rescinded and revoked in its entity.

Pearce motioned to open the meeting for public comment on the resolutions. Cummings seconded the motion, which passed with all members present voting in favor in a Voice Vote. There were no comments from the public.

Pearce motioned to close the meeting for public comment on the resolutions. Simone seconded the motion, which passed with all members present voting in favor in a Voice Vote.

Miller motioned to approve the consent agenda. Cummings seconded the motion, which passed with all members present voting in favor in a Roll Call Vote.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Pearce motioned to open the meeting to the public for privilege of the floor. Cummings seconded the motion, which passed with all members present voting in favor in a Voice Vote.

 John Feger – 37 N. Arlington Ave. – Commented that he is a patrolman with the Borough of Berlin and is seeking retirement in August. Mr. Feger further stated that he has been reaching out to various council members to negotiate an exit agreement without a response beyond their first meeting. The Solicitor indicated that Mayor and Council are not interested in entering into an exit agreement with Mr. Feger, and that he may retire under the existing laws of the state.

Badolato motioned to close the meeting to the public for privilege of the floor. Miller seconded the motion, which passed with all members present voting in favor in a Voice Vote.
